Gearing Up to Help as SNAP Benefit Ends

Putting enough food on the table is a struggle for many Houston families—inflation's higher food prices hit them hard and now they are taking another hit.

As of March 1, individuals and families receiving food stamps through the SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) saw their benefits go down an average of \$90 per month, bigger families saw a drop of up to \$250 per month. The reduction in benefits is due to the cessation of a pandemic expansion of the SNAP program.

Without that pandemic boost, the average food stamp benefit will drop from about \$9 per person, per day to about \$6, according to the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities. For 70-year-old Robert D., who visited CCSC's food pantry on March 15, that drop in benefits means he went from \$9.83 in food stamps per day to \$5.33.

"You have to make do with what you've got and it's hard," said Robert, a retired concrete worker. "Rent, electricity, gas, food, it's all gone up. And prices aren't coming down that I can see.

"I've cut out a whole lot of my food and try to make what I have last all month," Robert added. "CCSC is a lifesaver. It fills in the gaps."

More individuals like Robert and more families will be turning to CCSC to make up this SNAP difference. CCSC is gearing up, with your help, to meet those needs.
