# CCSC: Helping Families Move Forward



In 2024, the derecho and Hurricane Beryl blew through Houston and the pocketbooks of Houstonians living on the edge of poverty.

Following these severe weather events, low-income wage earners, seniors, and those on disability or facing financial crises found themselves up against not only a higher cost of living but the daunting task of trying to make rent and pay bills when they'd lost income, all the food in their refrigerators, or had damage to their homes or cars.

Those living in poverty are disproportionately affected by more than weather events. Each day we see families with a car repair or medical bill that has left them unable to pay rent or buy enough food. CCSC's Emergency Services programs served 8% more people this year than last, providing them with food, rent or utility assistance, clothing, and emergency dental and prescription aid—35% of those we served were children. To further offset high grocery prices, 6,417 pounds of fresh produce were distributed from our Garden and 88,503 pounds of food were distributed through our nine community Food Fairs.

Weathering financial storms is only possible with adequate wages and savings. CCSC's Workforce Development Program improves participant income levels through personalized coaching, computer classes, workshops, trainings, and skills classes that assist job seekers. Workforce Development served 27% more clients in 2024 and 82% of its career coaching graduates increased their incomes within three months of graduation.

Our vocational training programs, Martha's Way (residential housekeeping) and the Home Caregiver Training Program, graduated 199 new entrepreneurs this year. Martha's Way partnered with the St. Austin Center to provide this popular training to residents of the East End.

Our Back To School program outfitted 4,093 underserved children with school supplies; Jingle Bell Express brought Christmas joy to 2,673 children; and the Louise J. Moran Vision Care Program administered vision screenings to 2,544 children and glasses to 520 vision-impaired students. These Youth Services programs free up funds families can use for food, bills or rent.

### FEEDING HUNGER, FOSTERING HOPE, FURTHERING SUCCESS

Christian Community Service Center is a community-based nonprofit organization serving central and southwest Houston. Our coalition of 40 churches, volunteers and donors unite in our mission to serve the poor, hungry, disabled and otherwise needy while respecting their religious, ethnic or cultural differences. CCSC was created out of faith and founded in the belief that we are called to help all God's children heart to heart and hand in hand.

### How We Help

**BASIC NEEDS** CCSC provides crisis relief for people struggling to make ends meet. Our two locations, **Emergency Services-Central** and **Emergency Services-Southwest**, offer food, clothing, hygiene items, and financial assistance for rent, utilities and limited medical needs.

### 11,482

Nutritious 5-day food packages were provided to households facing hunger and food insecurity.

### 716

Households received rent or utility assistance, helping clients avoid homelessness and substandard living conditions; 65% of follow-up calls were successful and 98% of those contacted reported improved living situations, avoiding utility disconnection or eviction.

### 2,779

Households were provided with gently used clothing.

### 234

People received assistance obtaining prescription eyeglasses, emergency dental services or essential medications.

### 6,417

Pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables were harvested for clients from the CCSC Garden.

## How You Help

Since 1980, the unwavering commitment of CCSC's volunteer force and supporters has ensured the viability of CCSC's mission to help alleviate the effects of poverty in Houston.



In 2024, 1,666 volunteers contributed 30,663 hours to CCSC for an estimated value of \$979,384 in donated hours; 435 of those volunteers were involved in ongoing weekly or monthly roles.

CCSC donors and partners contributed generous funds and in-kind contributions in 2024 enabling us to help meet the widespread need in our community. We are deeply grateful for our church partners, volunteers, donors and community partners who make the work of CCSC possible.

workforce development programs CCSC equips job seekers with professional skills to build brighter futures. JobNet prepares motivated job seekers through classes and coaching. Martha's Way and the Home Caregiver Training Program cultivate talented entrepreneurs through hands-on vocational training and business skills development.

### 458

Job seekers gained valuable skills through workshops, computer training, computer lab access, and personalized job search assistance.

### 178

Entrepreneurs participated in a 42-hour residential housekeeping training program; 86% graduated and 144 job leads were shared with graduates.

### 57

Aspiring home caregivers participated in a 45-hour training covering technical, communication and business development skills; 81% graduated and 32 job leads were shared with graduates.

### 223

Clients pursued personalized employment and financial strategies for success with CCSC's career coaches.



YOUTH SERVICES supports the needs of vulnerable children and their families. Back To School promotes academic readiness and Jingle Bell Express addresses play, literacy and hunger. The Louise J. Moran Vision Care Program serves underprivileged students with vision screenings and glasses.

### 4.093

Students started the academic year with new school supplies, backpacks and clothing.

### 2.673

Children received new toys and books for Christmas; 1,050 families received a grocery gift card to address hunger.


### 2,544
